3. New Business

a. CMNNA residents Dan and Angela Kruse presented plans for demolition and reconstruction of their home at 701 Ottawa Trail. Dan and Angela have contacted Alder Cheeks as well as neighbors of their plans to build. Their proposal will go before the Land Use Planning Commission on Feb. 6, 2017. Construction to begin in April 2017 and completion in Dec. 2017. Thanks to Dan and Angela for a well-organized and thorough presentation. Plans are available on the cmnna.org website.

b. Carol Buelow read a letter that will be sent to the DOT that details concerns of neighbors turning from Mohawk Drive onto Nakoma Road, either heading east or west. After recent construction the sign that prohibited right turns from Midvale Boulevard onto Nakoma Road during weekday daytime hours was removed. The short time for motorists to go from Mohawk onto Nakoma Rd. creates a dangerous situation. Also noted were concerns on Nakoma Road for students of Cherokee Middle School trying to cross Nakoma Rd. with busy traffic.

c. Sue Reget, secretary, suggested CMNNA purchase letterhead for use for minutes and official correspondence.

d. Discussion on CMNNA committees. The following 4 were found to be the most important and that met the concerns of residents. (a survey was taken at the September annual meeting)
